- 1. The FFC's standard conditions of purchase shall apply.
- 2. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 3. Bidders are required to be tax compliant for all price quotations exceeding the value of R30 000 (VAT included). It is the responsibility of the bidder to ensure that the FFC is in possession of the bidder's Central Suppliers Database Supplier number. Validation of tax status will be confirmed through the CSD.
- 4. The bidder is required to submit a valid certified B-BBBEE certificate or an affidavit.
- 5. No services may be rendered, or goods delivered before an official FFC Purchase Order has been issued and received.
- 6. The successful bidder will be expected to sign a service level agreement (SLA) soon after the Purchase Order is issued and received (where applicable).
- 7. This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 system as prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.
- 8. Nothing in the RFQ or in the actions of FFC officials or employees must be construed as creating any expectation, legitimate or otherwise, regarding matters dealt with in the RFQ or any other matters not raised in the RFQ.

1. PURPOSE

These Terms of Reference invite potential Service Providers to provide insurance broking services to the FFC for a period of three (3) years.

These Terms of Reference invite potential Service Providers that possess the necessary experience and capabilities to submit a proposal. Request for quotation documents can be downloaded from the FFC's website: **www@ffc.co.za**/ Bid Number: **RFQ230402.**

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The appointed services provider would be required to provide short term insurance cover for FFC for but not limited to the following:

- 1. Movable assets.
 - a) Furniture and Fittings.
 - b) Computer Equipment.
 - c) Office Equipment.
 - d) Electronic Equipment

Additional assets below a specified amount (R50 000 each) should be automatically covered without declaration to the insurer.

- 2. Theft.
 - a) Damages to contents/ building because of theft, which leads to loss of FFC assets.
 - b) Theft value at 100% is considered adequate for the needs of FFC on office contents only.
 - c) Employee property to the value of R20 000
 - d) Malicious damage to property to R50 000 for refurbishment or replacement due to break in.
- 3. Directors and Officers Employer's Liability
 - a) Death or bodily injury to any person employed under a contract of service and which occurs during working hours of work or while he/she is driving for municipal duty in connection with such person's employment.

- b) Risk from personal losses if the Directors (Commissioners) / Officers (employees) are sued as a result of serving as a director or an officer of the Commission inclusive of legal or any other fees that the Commission may incur as a result of such.
- 4. SASRIA
 - a) Cover against riot, strike, and political action.
- 5. Insured risk
 - a) Cover against fire and natural disaster.
- 6. Cyber security risk cover
- 7. Successful supplier to do a comprehensive risk assessment of the institutions and its assets and liabilities.

UNDERWRITTING ADMINISTRATION

Regarding the underwriting administration function the appointed service provider will have been required to perform the following:

- 1. Provide FFC with quotation on any additional cover.
- Meet with FFC officials when required by either party to discuss or advise on insurance cover. Two meeting per financial year are expected to take place, however it might be more/less meetings depending on the technicality of the issues to be discussed.

CLAIMS ADMINISTRATION

Regarding the claim's administration function the appointed service provider will have is required to perform at least the following:

- a) Administer all FFC insurance claims (own- and third-party claims)
- b) Liaise with third party and FFC officials with regards to progress of the claims within a 30-day cycle from the date the claim was reported.
- c) Submit a monthly updated report on all claims, by no later than 5th of each month.
- d) Meet with FFC officials whenever required by both parties to discuss and advise on insurance claims.
- e) Have dedicated personnel to deal with FFC claims.

NB: insurer/broker is expected to obtain their own quotations for claims and do the necessary replacements/repairs and excess payments will be made directly to the broker/insurer.

PREMIUMS, RENEWAL/PLACEMENT OF FFC INSURANCE PORTFOLIO

The appointed service provider will have the following responsibilities:

- a) Assess FFC insurance requirements as reflected in the Asset Management policy.
- b) In the beginning of each financial year, updated (Asset registers) information must be collected from FFC to ensure all assets are adequately insured.
- c) Negotiate with underwriters on suitable terms and premium based on FFC existing cover and the updated claims experience.
- d) Have pre-renewal meetings with FFC in each of the financials years appointed for to discuss underwriting terms and premiums.
- e) Advise FFC and provide quotations on additional insurance cover that could be necessary to minimise risk.

NB: The insurer/broker must do annual reviews through physical visit to amend portfolio where necessary.

3. DURATION OF SERVICE

The services will be for a period of 36 months and the service provider will be expected to be available and start immediately as soon as a service level agreement is signed.

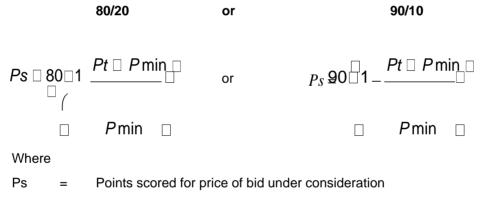

(e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

1. INTRODUCTION

The Protection of Personal Information Act, 4 of 2013, (POPIA) regulates and controls the collection, storage, use, transfer, and processing of a person's (in some instances a juristic person's) Personal Information. *In terms of the POPI Act, the Financial and Fiscal Commission (FFC) has a legal duty to process a person's Personal Information in a lawful, legitimate and responsible manner.*

The FFC does and will from time-to-time process Personal Information. "child" means a natural person under the age of 18 years who is not legally competent, without the assistance of a competent person, to take any action or decision in respect of any matter concerning himor herself;

"competent person" means any person who is legally competent to consent to any action or decision being taken in respect of any matter concerning a child;

"consent" means any voluntary, specific and informed expression of will in terms of which permission is given for the processing of Personal Information;

"data subject" means the person to whom Personal Information relates;

"operator" means a person who processes Personal Information for a responsible party in terms of a contract or mandate, without coming under the direct authority of that party;

"person" means a natural person or a juristic person;

"Personal Information" means information relating to an identifiable, living, natural person, and where it is applicable, an identifiable, existing juristic person, including, but not limited to—

(a) information relating to the race, gender, sex, pregnancy, marital status, national, ethnic or social origin, colour, sexual orientation, age, physical or mental health, well-being, disability, religion, conscience, belief, culture, language and birth of the person;

(b) information relating to the education or the medical, financial, criminal or employment history of the person;

(c) any identifying number, symbol, e-mail address, physical address, telephone number, location information, online identifier, or other particular assignment to the person;

(d) the biometric information of the person;

(e) the personal opinions, views, or preferences of the person;

(f) correspondence sent by the person that is implicitly or explicitly of a private or confidential nature or further correspondence that would reveal the contents of the original correspondence;

(g) the views or opinions of another individual about the person; and



(h) the name of the person if it appears with other Personal Information relating to the person or if the disclosure of the name itself would reveal information about the person.

"processing" means any operation or activity or any set of operations, whether or not by automatic means, concerning Personal Information, including—

(a) the collection, receipt, recording, organisation, collation, storage, updating or modification, retrieval, alteration, consultation or use;

(b) dissemination by means of transmission, distribution or making available in any other form; or

(c) merging, linking, as well as restriction, degradation, erasure or destruction of information;

"record" means any recorded information-

(a) regardless of form or medium, including any of the following:

(i) Writing on any material;

(ii) information produced, recorded or stored by means of any tape-recorder, computer equipment, whether hardware or software or both, or other device, and any material subsequently derived from information so produced, recorded or stored;

(iii) label, marking or other writing that identifies or describes anything of which it forms part, or to which it is attached by any means;

(iv) book, map, plan, graph or drawing;

(v) photograph, film, negative, tape or other device in which one or more visual images are embodied so as to be capable, with or without the aid of some other equipment, of being reproduced;

(b) in the possession or under the control of a responsible party;

(c) whether or not it was created by a responsible party; and

(d) regardless of when it came into existence;

"responsible party" means a public or private body or any other person who, alone or in conjunction with others, determines the purpose of and means for processing personal information;

3. PURPOSE FOR THE COLLECTION

3.1 The purpose for the collection of your Personal Information and the reason why FFC requires your Personal Information is to enable FFC to:

3.1.1 comply with lawful obligations, including all applicable labour, tax and financial legislation and/or the B-BBEE laws;

3.1.2 to give effect to a contractual relationship as between you and FFC and in order to ensure the correct administration of the relationship;

5. STORAGE AND RETENTION AND DESTRUCTION OF INFORMATION

5.1 All Personal Information which you provide to FFC will be held and/or stored securely and held for the purpose for which it was collected, as reflected above.

5.2 Your Personal Information will be stored electronically in a centralised data base, which, for operational reasons, will be accessible to authorised persons within FFC.

5.3 Where appropriate, some information may be retained in hard copy.

5.4 In either event, storage will be secure and audited regularly regarding the safety and the security of the information.

5.5 Once your Personal Information is no longer required due to the fact that the purpose for which the information was held has expired, such Personal Information will be safely and securely archived fora period of 5 years or longer, especially should this be required by any other law applicable in South Africa. Thereafter, all your Personal Information will be permanently destroyed.

6. ACCESS BY OTHERS

The FFC may from time to time have to disclose your Personal Information to other parties, and entities regulators and/or governmental officials but such disclosure will always be subject to an agreement which will be concluded between FFC and the party to whom it is disclosing your Personal Information, which contractually obliges the recipient of the Personal Information to comply with strict confidentiality and data security conditions.

11. DECLARATION AND INFORMED CONSENT
